Season's greetings everyone from the Museum. Have a safe and happy holiday. Come in and visit us over the holidays. We are open every Sunday 12.30-3.30pm and can open for groups or if someone is especially keen to look at family info and can't come any other time. We have two new members on our Museum Committee this year and will also need a couple of new volunteers to help with our Sunday roster which starts in March 2025.

We get many requests for family information and recently had to send one of our books – *Portobello* – *A Brief History* to the UK. This book plus our other book – *Otago Peninsula Then and Now* would make a great Christmas gift. The books are available from the Museum, the Macandrew Bay Library or the Portobello Shop. \$30 each.

We have also been asked, from Hastings, for information about the Reverend Alexander Greig. Mr Greig served as minister to the Peninsula Presbyterian parishes for 36 years, from its founding in 1868. He travelled by horse, gig or walked between each parish. The first Presbyterian Church built on the Peninsula was at Pukehiki in 1868. Rev Greig married his wife Jane in Aberdeen in 1867 and two weeks later boarded the ship *Robert Henderson* bound for Port Chalmers. He died in 1938 aged 99 years and is buried, alongside his family, in the Portobello Cemetery.

Recently we were donated a doll, which looks old but it's not. Bartholomina dolls were made in limited numbers in South Africa between 1976 and 1982 and were porcelain dolls to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the arrival of the 1820 settlers in the Eastern Cape, South Africa. This doll belonged to a person from Macandrew Bay.

In the next week or so we will be holding our annual BBQ lunch at the Museum to thank our wonderful volunteers who have supported us over the year.

People in the Bay

Macandrew Bay is full of amazing people. On a lifestyle property near you lives **Samantha Montgomerie** with her husband, an IT Architect and her 16 year old son Flynn. I read an article in the ODT earlier this year about Samantha Montgomerie, a local teacher and prolific author of more than 70 education readers, being invited to attend the HarperCollins author party in London. Education readers may seem simple but they all have a specific purpose to help young children learn to read. It is imperative that the stories are engaging and capture the interest of the child so they want to read. Being a teacher and a writer sounded an amazing combination of skills to have and of course I wanted to find out more about her and how the author party had gone.

The trip to London and the author party was a fantastic experience for Samantha. After five years of writing for HarperCollins, she finally got to meet and talk with her editors and publishers. Samantha has always loved reading and writing her own stories so encouraging her own students to become lifelong readers has been a strong focus in Samantha's teaching. She excitedly told me that her year 7 English classes read over 800 books in eight weeks! She loves teaching and says that children inspire her writing. That is a teacher that you want your children to have.

In 2022 Samantha won the Storylines Janice Marriott Mentoring Award for junior or young adult fiction. Her novel *The Cloudkeepers*, is set at Allans Beach, a favourite place of mine, is now completed and is currently out with publishers. For lovers of poetry, a real Dunedin treat Samantha is recommending, is a collection of poetry called PERCH which consists of poems written about Dunedin by Dunedin poets including herself. This book is available at the University bookshop.

Samantha has published a large and diverse volume of works including fiction and non-fiction stories, novels and poetry. Many of her books are available to purchase at very reasonable prices. 2025 will be a different and exciting year for Samantha as she will be The Otago College of Education/Creative New Zealand Children's Writer in Residence. Being granted this prestigious University of Otago Fellowship, means she will spend the year writing a fiction novel for 8 to 12 year old children called *Sea and Sky Collide*. Set in the Marlborough Sounds, this promises to be an action packed story that addresses a variety of topical issues

showing readers they are never too young to stand up for what they believe in. She will miss her students, but being able to focus solely on her writing for a whole year is "Living the dream".

The downside this year is the funding cuts which affect the maintenance of grass verges, and unfortunately the harbour edge will be a victim with less regular trimming. With the October rain event we have had a lot of damage, mostly with slips causing road closures. While most were cleared up quickly, some areas have required major rebuilds. This results in traffic management issues which just require patience from road users. Summer is kicking off around Ōtepoti Dunedin, and with that comes sea lions!

Walking along beaches in the Otago and Southland area you may come across individual or groups of sea lions. This can be



exciting but it is very important to keep a distance of at least 20 metres between you and the nearest sea lion for both your own and the sea lion's safety. Dogs must be controlled by leads within 20 metres of sea lions or any other coastal wildlife.

Sea lion pups and yearlings can be very inquisitive and at times can approach people out of curiosity. If this happens, back away slowly and try to be as uninteresting as you possibly can!

Whilst numbers of sea lions are increasing on the New Zealand mainland, they are still an endangered species numbering less than 12,000, so it is a privilege for us to be sharing our beaches and coastline with them. If you have any concerns for a sea lion (or any other native wildlife) in danger, please contact 0800 DOC HOT (0800 362 468) in the first instance.

Invasive Pest Plants Update

ORC Eco Fund Darwins Barberry Project

SWAT obtained a grant from the Otago Regional Council ECO Fund in May to tackle invasive Darwin's Barberry (DB) in the Pukehiki area. We were also awarded ORC funds for a separate but related project to check for outlying DB bushes at the Sandymount and Sandfly DOC Reserves. Here's a quick summary of what we've achieved so far on both projects. With the DB in full orange flower and highly visible from July onwards, the volunteer team eradicated large numbers of bushes and pulled seedlings on properties across the 85 ha Pukehiki project area. We engaged contractor Habitat Restorations to tackle the larger trees and thickets on one property in August and they will return later to sort out other difficult DB areas. We also asked OPBG (the Biodiversity Group) to spot DB bushes for us during their possum work on the DOC Reserves. Suddenly the three bushes we knew about on the DOC Reserves expanded in number to 12 including discoveries at Boulder Beach, thank you OPBG. All 12 DB bushes are now eradicated.

But there may be more DB out there. So Portobello resident Ryan Adams (Peak Geospatial) flew high resolution drone surveys at Sandfly and Sandymount Reserves (with permission) in September and produced high quality orthophotos from which we will try and identify DB bushes. We can then use the Avenza app to locate where these suspected DB outliers are on the ground. We have no idea how many new bushes we may find out there.

This project is exciting and daunting in equal measure for our small team of volunteers. We get to use new technology and we have the focus of a funded project to spur us on. Thank you ORC, thank you Ryan and thank you to Pukehiki landowners for granting us access.




